- 1. Provide relevant, engaging texts.
- 2. Increase reading volume.
- 3. Provide student choice.
- 4. Increase reading of nonfiction.
- 5. Develop independence.
- 6. Provide a highly effective, <u>short-term</u> intervention.
- 7. Provide the intervention as a <u>supplement</u> to classroom instruction.
- 8. Engage students in <u>meaningful talk</u> about texts.
- 9. <u>Match texts</u> to readers' current abilities and then provide teaching to expand to new levels.
- 10. Deepen and expand comprehension.
- 11. Expand <u>vocabulary</u>.
- 12. Expand strategies for word solving.
- 13. Increase <u>fluency</u> in reading and writing.
- 14. Connect <u>reading and writing</u> for deeper comprehension.
- 15. Support the specific needs of English Language Learners.
- 16. Keep the teacher-student <u>ratio low</u>.
- 17. Make lessons fast-paced and highly structured.
- 18. Provide <u>frequent</u> lessons.
- 19. Increase <u>teacher expertise</u>.
- 20. Connect to the <u>classroom and homes</u>.
