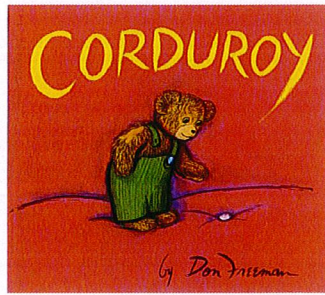


Dialogic Reading Questions for “Corduroy” by Don Freeman



“Children learn more from books when they are actively involved. Dialogic Reading is a method that helps children become involved in the story.” (www.ala.org)

Using the C.A.R. method, ask the following questions:

Comment: “I see a big store” – Wait . . . (p.6)

Ask a question: “What do you think will happen?” – Wait . . . (After reading p.7)

Respond: Respond to what your child says after you ask the question

Comment: “Corduroy looks worried.” – Wait . . . (p.9)

Ask a question: “Do you think Corduroy will find his button?” – Wait . . . (p. 9)

Respond: Respond to what your child says after you ask the question

Comment: “Corduroy is going up an escalator” – Wait . . . (p.12)

Ask a question: “Where do you think Corduroy will end up?” – Wait . . . (p. 13)

Respond: Respond to what your child says after you ask the question
